SUBJECT: Purchase vehicle, hydraulic excavator, and equipment attachments.

RECOMMENDATION:

Approve the purchase of the following:

- 1) Agency office pool vehicle (2013 Toyota Prius C Hybrid).
- 2) Hydraulic excavator (Caterpillar 324EL long-reach).
- 3) Equipment attachments (36" bucket, 24" compaction wheel, quick coupler, and pavement brush).

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The combined total cost of these purchases is \$318,052. These purchases are specifically included in the Agency's approved FY 2013-2014 budget (Admin: \$23,216, Ulatis Project: \$267,737, Solano Project: \$27,099).

BACKGROUND:

Agency Vehicle (\$23,216):

Currently, SCWA has two 4x4 vehicles that are shared among office staff and interns. These all purpose vehicles are used both on road (e.g., attending meetings) and off road (e.g., inspecting SCWA facilities). All other SCWA vehicles are assigned to field staff. SCWA proposes to purchase a Toyota Prius C that is dedicated to city/highway use by office staff and interns. This compact hybrid car is much more fuel efficient (53 mpg city/46 mpg highway) than existing SCWA vehicles.

Hydraulic Excavator (\$267,737):

SCWA rents a long-reach excavator each year, between October and December, to perform maintenance activities on the Ulatis Flood Control Project (UFCP) – a network of earthen drainage channels used to transport agricultural water and storm runoff. The local availability of long-reach excavators for rent is poor, and there is no guarantee that a machine will be available to SCWA when needed for routine maintenance or emergency repairs of the UFCP. In addition, City of Vacaville, SID, and Maine Prairie Water District commonly rent long-reach excavators, and SCWA's purchase of a long-reach excavator would increase the rental availability to these agencies and insure availability to SCWA.

SCWA typically spends between \$10,000-\$40,000/year on long-reach excavator rentals, depending on machine availability and needed UFCP maintenance activities.

Equipment Attachments (\$27,099):

SCWA proposes to purchase a bucket, compaction wheel, and a quick coupler for its small hydraulic excavator (Cat 314) and a pavement brush for its multi-purpose skid steer (ASV). This equipment is used to maintain Agency projects, properties, and implement creek restoration activities. The purchase of these attachments will increase the applicability of those tools, towards Agency work, in addition to increasing the efficiency of the machines.

RECOMMENDATION:

Authorize Chairman to execute a Memorandum of Understanding to provide funding for Countywide Aerial Imagery Services.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

Cost share of \$14,430 for the first year of Countywide Aerial Imagery Services is included in the current budget. Total Agency cost share is \$86,581 over 6 years.

BACKGROUND:

The Countywide Aerial Imagery Services Memorandum of Understanding is an agreement between the County of Solano and the Cities of Vacaville, Fairfield, Vallejo, Benicia, Dixon, Suisun, Rio Vista, and Fairfield-Suisun Sewer District, the Vallejo Sanitation and Flood Control District, Solano Irrigation District, Solano Transportation Authority, Solano County Water Agency, and the United States Air Force.

Products from this agreement include: Countywide aerial images (3 flights or sets of images over the next 10 years), LiDAR (elevation) data Countywide, license to use the software for the images, and training on how to use the software.

The Agency has need of the Countywide Aerial Imagery for the purposes of planning future flood control projects and improving ongoing maintenance and operations of the Ulatis and Green Valley Flood Control Projects and the Solano Project. The data will also help the Agency maintain a rigorous GIS platform for planning of future infrastructure or flood emergencies. The collective cost share of this program greatly reduces the cost of individual surveys for the Agency.

COOPERATIVE COUNTY AGREEMENT

TO PROVIDE FUNDING FOR COUNTYWIDE AERIAL IMAGERY SERVICES

RECITALS

- A. Solano and Participants are interested in County wide Aerial Imagery for the purposes of both emergency services and improved maintenance and planning of current and future public infrastructure.
- B. Solano and Participants wish to retain the services of a consultant/vendor with expertise in aerial imagery and remote sensing technology.
- C. The firm of Pictometry, Inc. has special expertise in this area.
- D. Participants have requested that Solano enter into an agreement with Pictometry, Inc, on their mutual behalf, and are willing to share in associated costs, and Solano is willing to enter into an agreement with Pictometry under the terms described below.

AGREEMENT

Solano and Participants agree as follows:

1. <u>RECITALS</u>

The above recitals are true and correct.

2. <u>COMMUNICATION/DESIGNATED REPRESENTATIVES</u>

The persons designated below shall, upon execution of this Agreement, have authority to grant discretionary approvals identified in this Agreement. 3. <u>SOLANO RESPONSIBILITIES</u>

- A. Solano shall prepare and negotiate an agreement with Pictometry, Inc. to provide aerial imagery services for Solano and Participants in an amount not to exceed ONE MILLION FOUR HUNDRED TEN THOUSAND FOUR HUNDRED FORTY THREE Dollars and NINETY SIX CENTS (\$1,443,021.96), and in generally the form attached as ATTACHMENT A.
- B. Solano shall act as liaison with Pictometry, Inc. and provide any necessary project management, direction and coordination. This responsibility includes coordinating necessary meetings and providing status updates and

Pictometry, Inc. analysis to Participants and their Designated Representatives.

- C. Solano shall provide Participants with a written accounting of all expenditures upon completion of the work identified in Attachment A. Should Pictometry, Inc. complete the work for less than \$1,443,021.96, Solano shall return such remaining funds to each Participant on a proportional basis , unless otherwise directed by the Participants.
- D. Solano shall maintain complete and accurate records of all associated transactions in compliance with generally accepted accounting principles as promulgated by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants and the Governmental Accounting Standards Board. Such records shall be available to each Participant upon reasonable notice for inspection and analysis during business hours.

4. <u>PARTICIPANT RESPONSIBILITIES</u>

Within fourteen (14) calendar days of execution of this Agreement, each Participant shall deposit the following pro-rata share to cover the anticipated contract costs and expenses to Solano County.

5. <u>ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS</u>

- A. <u>Authority to Amend Agreement</u>: Changes to this Agreement may only be made by written amendment, signed by all Participants. The Designated Representatives identified above are authorized to execute amendments to the Agreement provided that the amendments do not substantially change the scope of the Agreement or increase the cost to any Participant by more than ten (10) percent.
- B. <u>Construction</u>: To the fullest extent allowed by law, the provisions of this Agreement shall be construed and given effect in a manner that avoids any violation of statute, ordinance, regulation, or law. The parties covenant and agree that in the event that any provision of this Agreement is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, void, or unenforceable, the remainder of the provisions shall remain in full force and effect and shall in no way be affected, impaired, or invalidated.
- C. <u>Making of Agreement</u>: Participants and Solano acknowledge that each has contributed to the drafting of this Agreement and that, in the event of a dispute over the Agreement's interpretation; the language of the Agreement will not be construed against one party in favor of another. Participants and Solano acknowledge that they have each had an adequate opportunity to consult with counsel in the negotiation and preparation of this Agreement.
- D. <u>No Third-Party Beneficiaries</u>: Nothing contained in this Agreement shall be construed to create, and the parties do not intend to create, any rights in third parties.
- E. <u>Applicable Law and Forum</u>: This Agreement shall be construed and interpreted according to the substantive law of the State of California. Any action to enforce the terms of this Agreement or for the breach thereof shall be brought and tried in the County of Solano.
- F. <u>Captions</u>: The captions in this Agreement are solely for convenience of reference. They are not a part of this Agreement and shall have no effect on its construction or interpretation.
- G. <u>Merger</u>: This writing is intended both as the final expression of the Agreement between the parties with respect to the included terms and as a complete and exclusive statement of the terms of the Agreement, pursuant to

Code of Civil Procedure Section 1856. No modification of this Agreement shall be effective unless and until such modification is evidenced by a writing signed by both parties.

- H. <u>Time of Essence</u>: Time is and shall be of the essence of this Agreement and every provision.
- I. <u>Entire Agreement</u>: This Agreement is the entire Agreement between the parties.
- J. <u>Copyright</u>: The services provided by Pictometry, Inc. under its contract may be subject to copyright laws. Each party shall take such steps as may be appropriate to maintain the applicable copyrights of Pictometry, Inc.'s work.
- K. <u>Effective Date</u>: This Agreement shall become effective upon execution by Solano and all Participants.

6. <u>TERMINATION</u>

Any Participant may terminate its participation in this Agreement by giving sixty (60) days advance written notice to all other parties of its intent to terminate its participation in this Agreement. Termination shall not relieve the Participant of its obligation to pay costs and expenses related to the consultant contract or otherwise allocated prior to the effective date of the termination.

7. <u>INDEMNIFICATION</u>

- A. Except as provided in Paragraph 7.B. below, each party shall indemnify, defend, protect, hold harmless, and release the other, their officers, agents, and employees, from and against any and all claims, losses, proceedings, damages, causes of action, liability, costs, or expense (including attorneys' fees and witness costs) arising from or in connection with, or caused by any negligent act or omission or willful misconduct of such indemnifying party. This indemnification obligation shall not be limited in any way by any limitation on the amount or type of damages or compensation payable to or for the indemnifying party under workers' compensation acts, disability benefit acts, or other employee benefit acts.
- B. In addition, the parties acknowledge that pursuant to this Agreement, Solano will enter and administer a contract with Pictometry, Inc. on behalf of the parties to this Agreement. The parties agree to provide a common defense to any claims against Solano which arise out of its performance under said paragraph 3, excepting claims arising out of Solano's sole negligence. If any such claim is made against Solano, the parties shall meet and agree on the manner of providing that defense and on the equal sharing of the costs thereof and of any settlement or judgment.

SUBJECT: Amendment No. 10 to the Agreement with Southwest Environmental Incorporated for the Installation of High-Efficiency Toilets at Commercial, Industrial and Institutional locations

RECOMMENDATION:

Authorize General Manager to execute Amendment No. 10 to the Agreement with Southwest Environmental Incorporated (SWE) for the installation of High-Efficiency Toilets (HETs) at Commercial, Industrial and Institutional (CII) locations.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

Increase contract amount by \$22,145 from \$801,000 to \$823,145. Funding has been allocated for this work in the water conservation budget for the 2012/13 year.

BACKGROUND:

This program offers Solano County CII customers the opportunity to receive new high-efficiency toilets (HETs) at no cost to replace older, high water use toilets. HETs were first introduced in the U.S. in 1998 (after years of successful use in Europe and Australia) and use 20% less water than the current available Ultra-Low Flush toilets. Installation of HETs can save 90 gallons per HET compared to older, high-water use toilets.

SCWA and the cities of Benicia, Fairfield and Vacaville are members of the California Urban Water Conservation Council (CUWCC) and as such have agreed to implement various water conservation Best Management Practices (BMPs). Other cities, notably Suisun City and Vallejo receive Solano Project water and as USBR contractors are also obligated to implement water use efficiency measures. SWE has extensive experience working with water districts and other municipalities throughout California and the country. They are also CUWCC members.

This amendment is necessary due to increased participation in the program during Fiscal Year 2012/13.
