SUBJECT: SWRCB Stress Test: Water Supply for 2017-2019

On May 31, 2016 the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) finalized their revised Drought Emergency Water Conservation regulation (copy attached). The revised regulation allows urban water agencies to conduct "stress tests" to determine the level of conservation – expressed as a percentage –they must achieve to comply with the revised regulation. Pursuant to the revised regulation, urban water wholesalers such as the Solano County Water Agency (SCWA) are required to post online the projected water supplies to be made available to the corresponding urban water retailers, for Water Years 2017-2019. SCWA has completed the aforementioned water supply projections, which are posted, along with this memo, at http://www.scwa2.com/water-supply.

The "stress test" conducted by SCWA pursuant to the revised Drought Emergency Water Conservation regulation confirms that SCWA's wholesale supplies meet or exceed the projected demands for the cities of Benicia, Fairfield, Suisun City, Vacaville and Vallejo, for 2017 to 2019. SCWA's wholesale supplies include the Solano Project (Entitlements, Transfers, Purchases, Carryover) and the State Water Project (Table A and Carryover). By June 22, each of our urban member agencies will individually submit their own water supply and projected use data to the SWRCB. Furthermore, some of our member agencies will list other water supplies and corresponding demands, which are not managed by SCWA.
