- **1. Remote Meeting Action Item:** Government Code Section 54953(e) added by Assembly Bill 361 ends in March and the next meeting will be in-person. All LPCCC members will attend in-person at the Vacaville offices. A zoom link for the public will be used, if available.
- **2. Public Comment:** Jeff TenPas requests that a report on groundwater conditions in Winters Putah Creek Park be placed on a future agenda. Chris Lee suggested we wait until the Solano GSA annual reports due in April/May.

4. Nishikawa CEQA update

Nishikawa is a 30-acre restoration project on Putah Creek near Pedrick Rd and managed by SCWA. A CEQA process is required.

- Programmatic EIR for all of Putah Creek (adopted in 2017 and update in 2022)
- Nishikawa Specific Initial Study and Mitigated Negative Declaration a Mitigated Negative Declaration (MND) have been prepared.
- Public hearing to adopt the Nishikawa MND will be held at the SCWA Board Meeting April 13, 2023
- Noticing and Public Comment Period on the MND 30 days before the hearing

There were no further questions or comments.

5. Putah Creek Monitoring Data Summit

A one-day meeting will be held at UC Davis on March 16, 2023 covering more than a dozen long-term monitoring programs on Putah Creek (water flow, water temperature, adult salmon carcass counts, juvenile salmon counts by 2 methods, salmon tagging, fish species diversity in two programs, birds, bats, and more). These monitoring programs were reviewed at the April 14, 2022, LPCCC Board meeting.

Representatives from the different programs will share information and address the issue of data availability. Kluge commented that rules for data availability should be included as deliverables in future monitoring contracts.

Goals of the Meeting:

- 1. Standardize Salmon Return Monitoring
- 2. Identify and plan to curate (maintain accessibility) to long-term data sets

Ancillary Goals:

- 1. Capture primary/secondary monitoring questions (that is, what the monitoring aims to answer)
- 2. Identify all past datasets (other fish, birds, hydrogeography, water quality, restoration sites, etc.)
- 3. Identify data gaps
- 4. Funding source discussion

6. Planning Subcommittee Report

The last meeting of the subcommittee was 2/16/2023.

PCWM: Putah Creek Water Management

PCWM is the main charge of the Subcommittee. The facilitation firm (Ag Innovations) and the water rights engineering firm (MBK) have been contracted to assist the LPCCC with PCWM. Ag Innovations gave an update to the Subcommittee on 2/16/2023 in preparation for a future report to the full LPCCC. The Subcommittee is also addressing the Streamkeeper Annual Performance Review and the SCWA Workforce Study. There is nothing to further report currently. The next subcommittee meeting will be March 2, 2023. There were no further questions. The PCWM timeline calendar was shown with no discussion (it has been reviewed in previous meetings).

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8. Pattern Calendar

The pattern calendar has 4 items this month.

1. Riparian Diversions – this a major topic for the PCWM project. The Streamkeeper mentioned that we will try to avoid the regular minimum flow violations coming up in May (2023), but that issue has not been resolved. The three Accord Flow Compliance Locations were reviewed on a map.

2. Interagency Communications

Ca Department of Water Resources (DWR) interagency communication are are on VA (Voluntary Agreements Early Implementation Projects) and identifying funding for LPCCC priority projects. Ca Dept of Fish and Wildlife manager of the Yolo Bypass Wildlife Area (Joe Hobbs) is retiring soon. Joe has been a great cooperator on Putah Creek issues. Other interagency communication is noted in the Streamkeeper Report agenda item.

3. Fish Monitoring

Ongoing monitoring of salmon and other resident fish species continues. Salmon fry monitoring is beginning by snorkel viewing and the UC Davis Rotary Screw Trap (installation net month).

4. Annual Workplan

The Planning Subcommittee is reviewing last year's plan and metrics in preparation for the 2023 plan.

9. Streamkeeper Report

Timing of the spring pulse flow was discussed. It is hoped that rain will naturally satisfy the pulse flow requirements. If not, the pulse flows will be released from storage.

The new fish passage features installed at 106a in November 2022 have survived the winter storm flows and are still operating normally (video was presented). The placement of boards on the flashboard riser during irrigation season was discussed. Opportunities for counting salmon in the culvert were discussed.

Public comments from SCWA on the Scientific Basis of the Voluntary Agreements was mentioned.
